LEWIS, Meriwether (1774–1809),

American explorer, born in Ivy, Va. He served in the army before 1801 when he became the private secretary to President Thomas Jefferson. In 1803 Jefferson appointed him commander of an expedition to explore the new territory acquired in the Louisiana Purchase. Lewis chose the American explorer William Clark as joint commander; the expedition (*see* LEWIS AND CLARK EXPEDITION,), a remarkable achievement, ended in 1806, and the following year Lewis was made governor of the northern part of the Louisiana Territory. During this time he was troubled by financial problems and apparently by problems with alcohol and depression. He died at Grinder's Inn on the Natchez trail in Tennessee, while en route to Washington, D.C.; historians debate whether he was murdered or committed suicide. Meriwether Lewis National Monument in Tennessee, which commemorates Lewis's achievements, is in the Natchez Trace National Parkway (established in 1938).
